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Message From the Founder

2012 was another record year for NKR with 226 exchange transplants completed. This represents a 29% increase in NKR facilitated transplants over 2011 and accounts for approximately half of all U.S. exchange transplants (OPTN reports 441 completed in 2011 and 378 completed from January through September of 2012).

December, was our biggest month ever with the completion of 37 exchange transplants in a single month... 50% more than NKR facilitated during the entire year of 2008 (our first year of operations). The week before Christmas was also a record month with 17 transplants completed in a single week.

In this report, we present for the first time, several new charts including matching efficiency and match conversion rates. These two charts demonstrate the enormous volume of match offers and cross matches that are required to facilitate our rapidly growing number of transplants (1,623 individual matches offered resulted in 226 transplants). The low conversion rates represent a significant opportunity to increase match efficiency through the utilization of the donor pre-select function, exploratory cross matching and requests for additional donor information. All of these system features occur prior to an actual match offer, allowing for vast improvements in conversion rates. As conversion rates improve, there will be fewer match cancellations, less disappointment from swaps that fall apart and patients will be transplanted more quickly.

None of this success would be possible without the effort and dedication of the medical professionals at our Member Centers. Thank you - and keep up the great work.

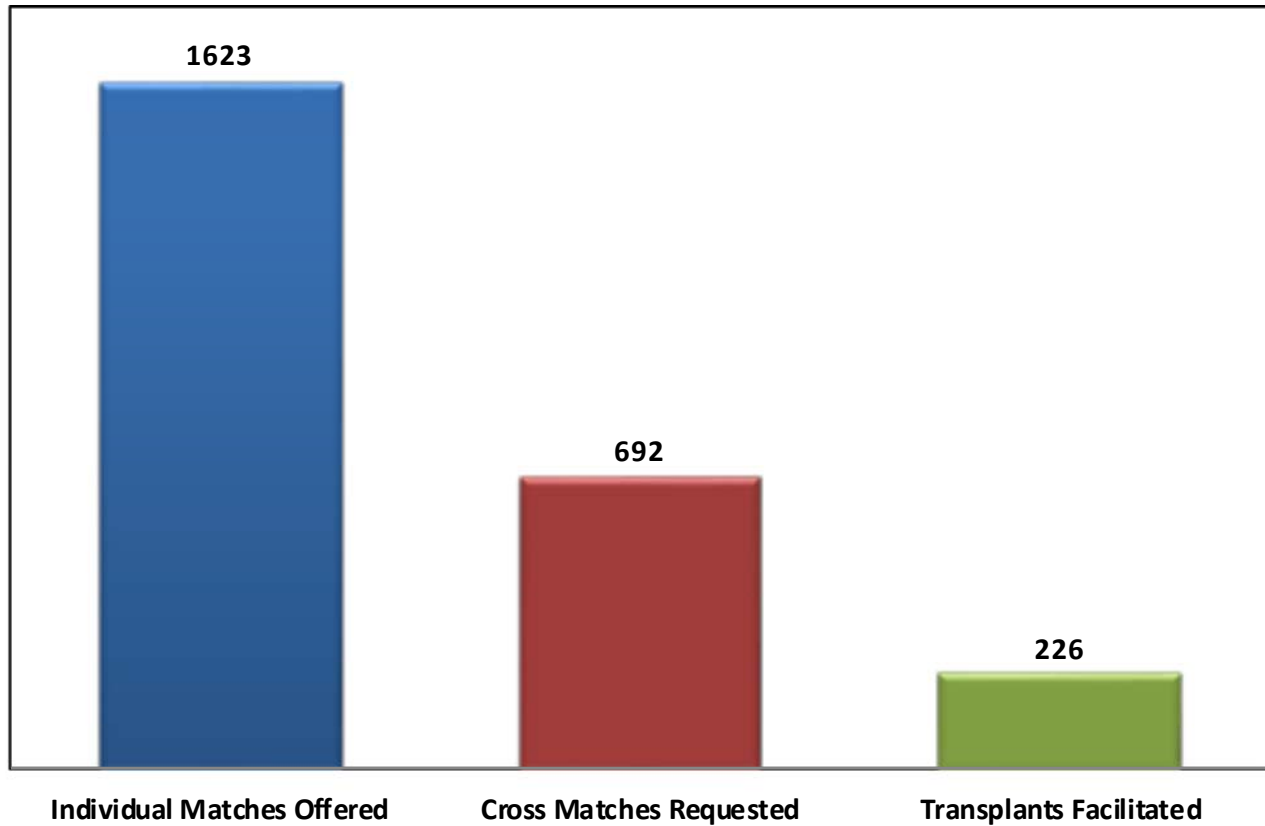

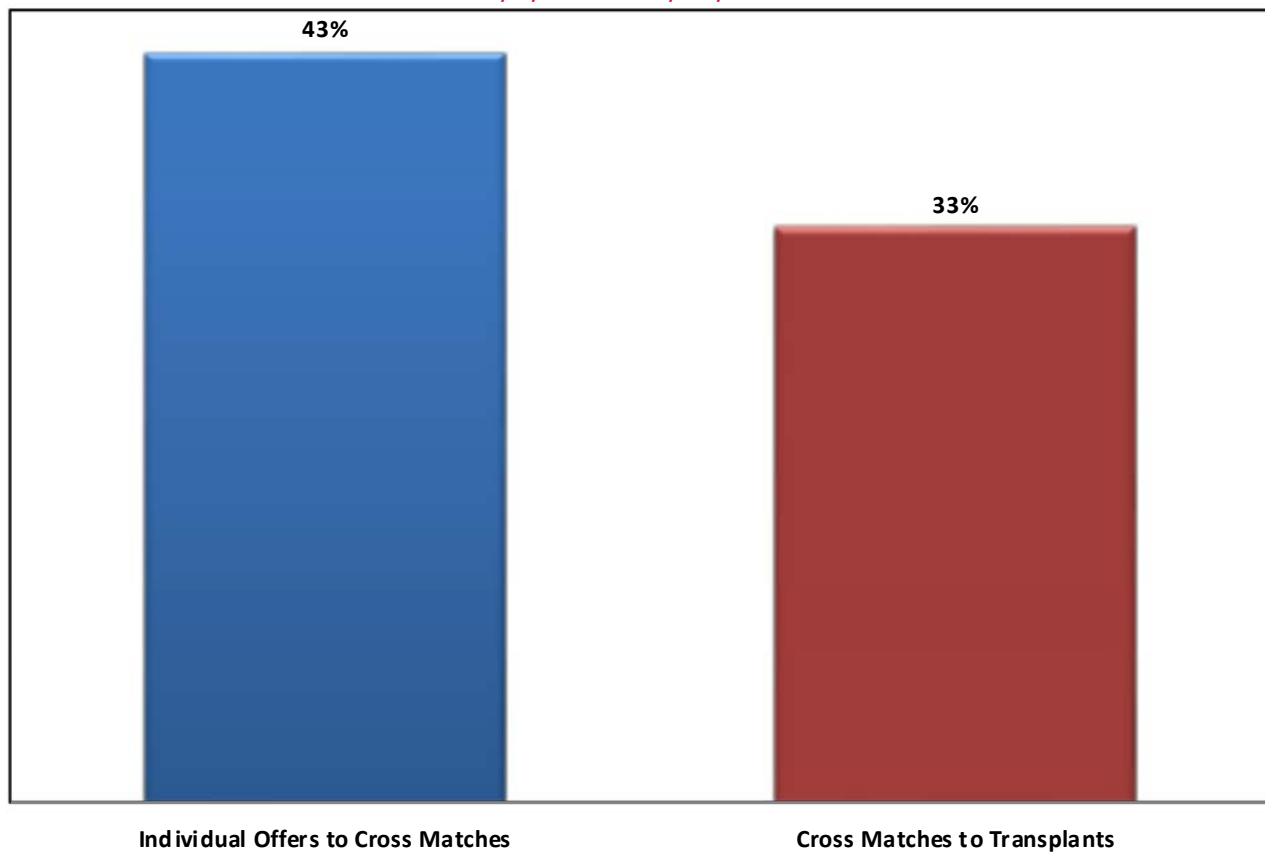
Matching Efficiency

1/1/2012 - 12/31/2012

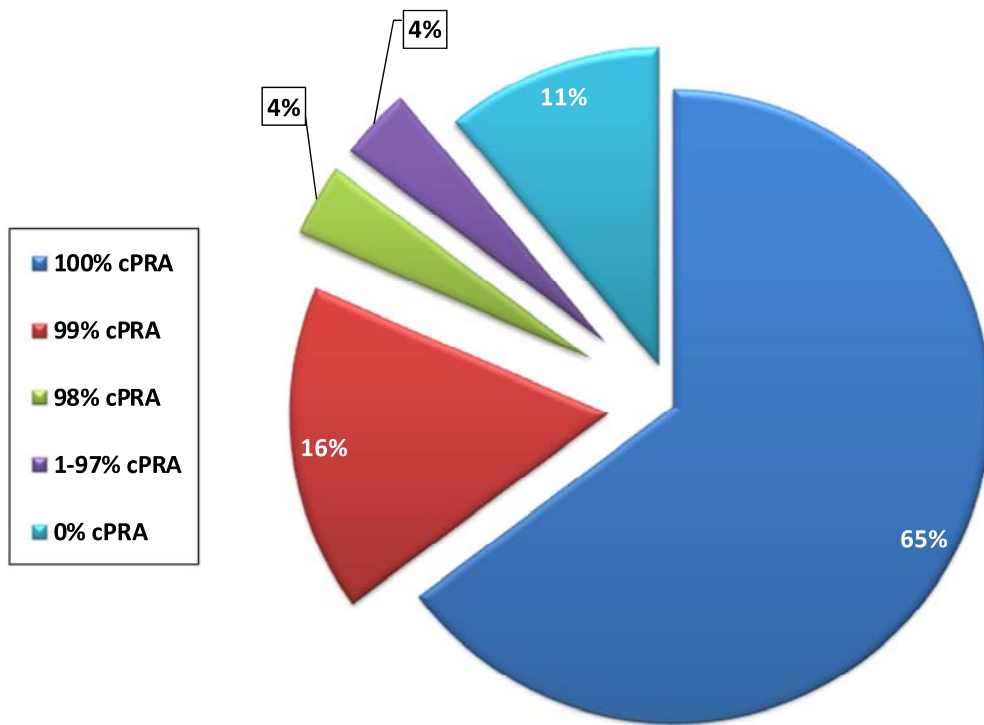


Match Conversion Rates

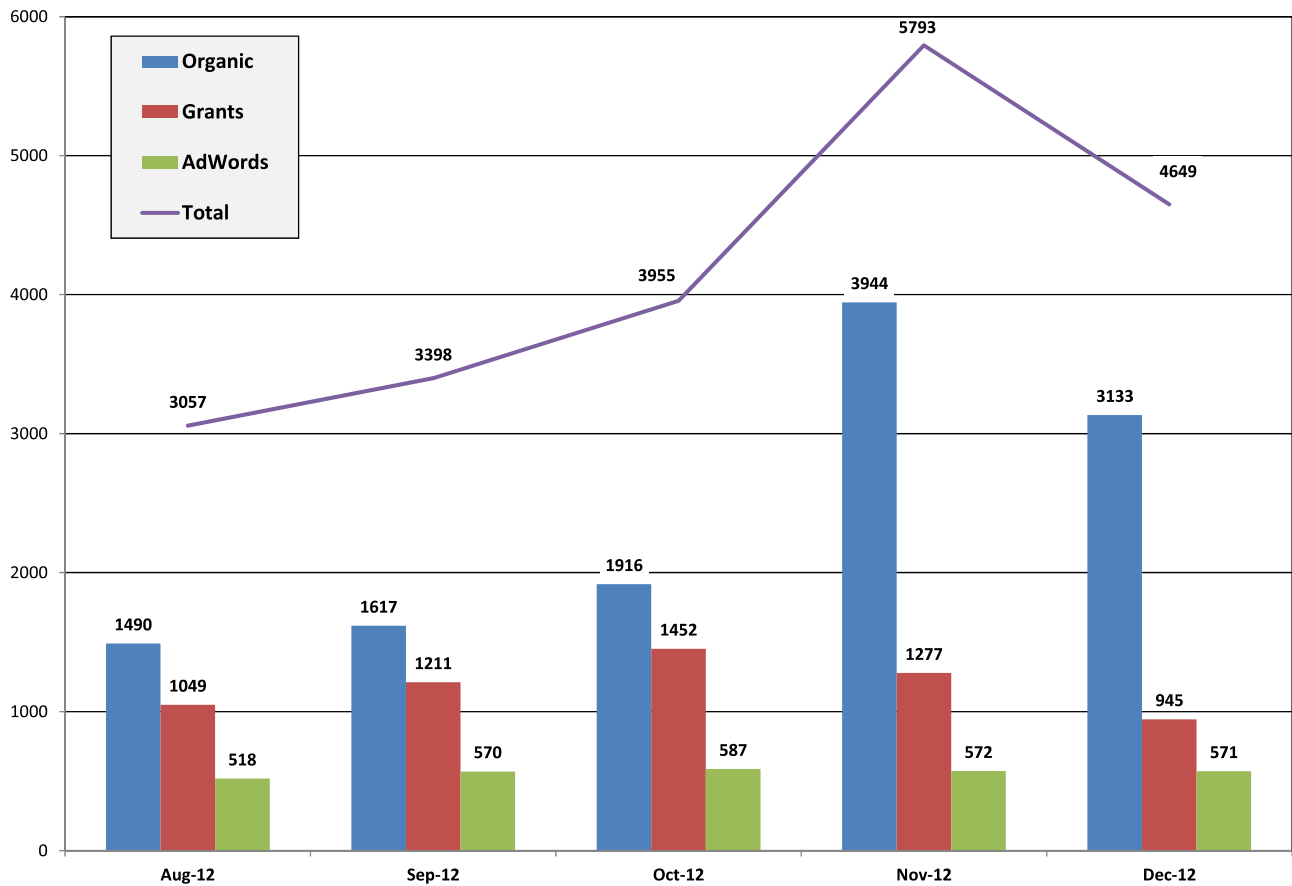

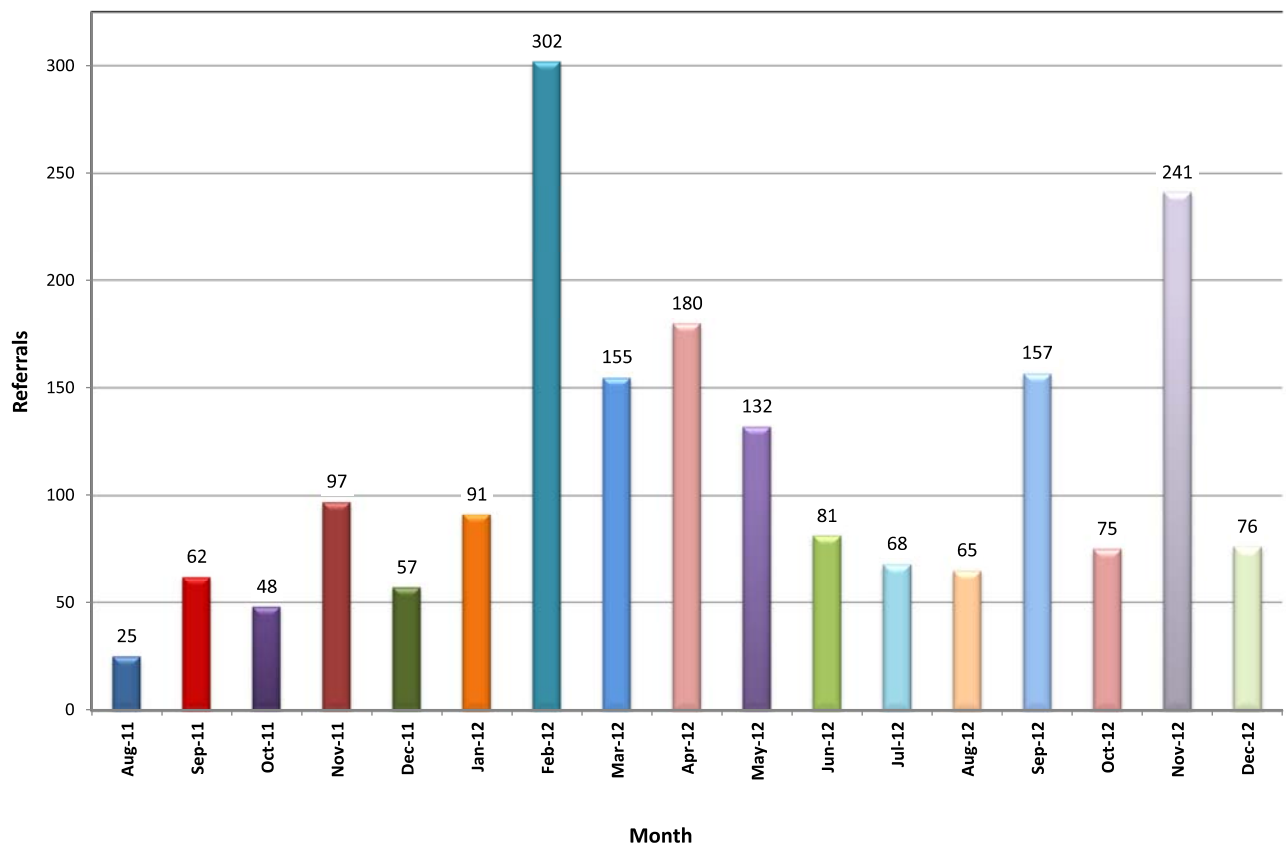
Wait Times >1 Year by cPRA



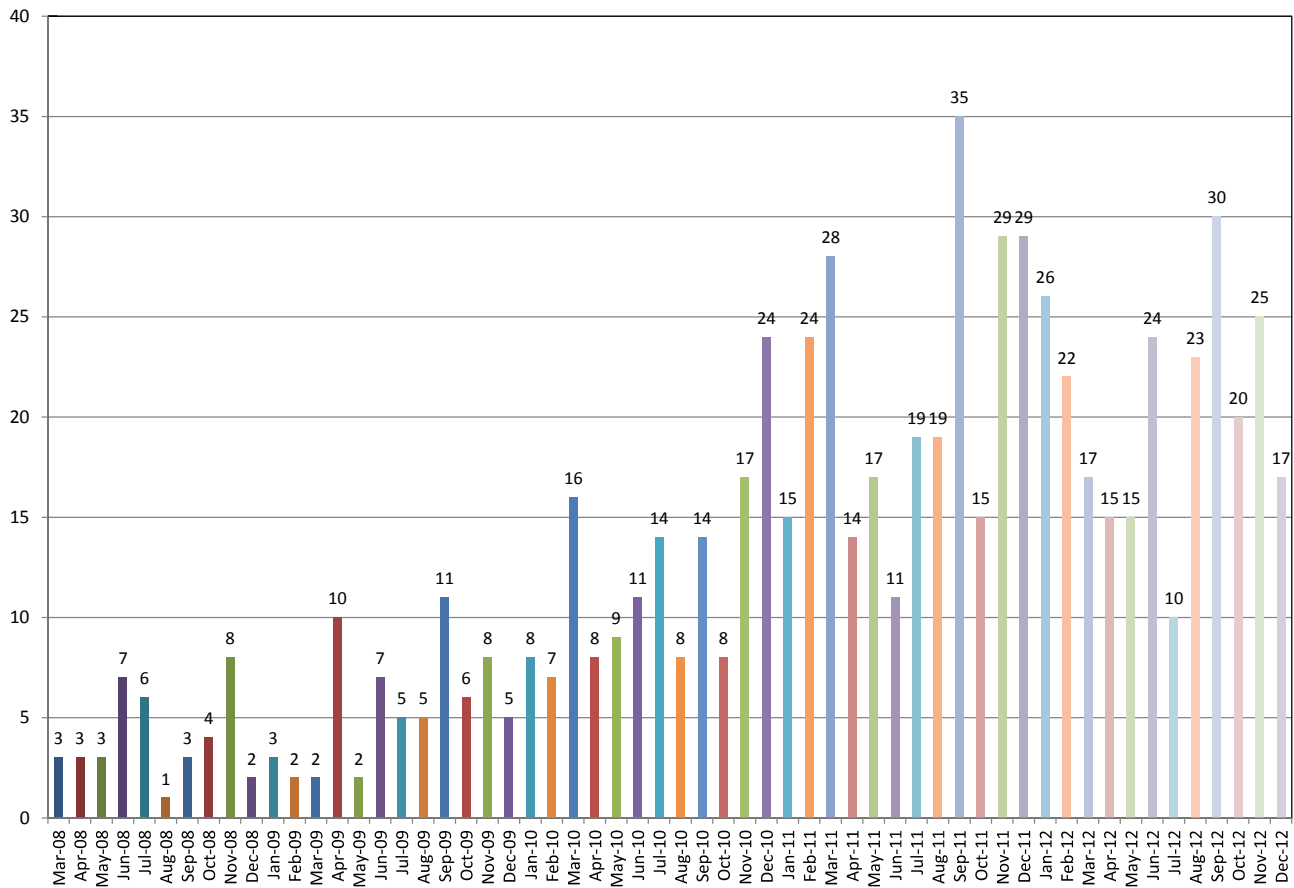

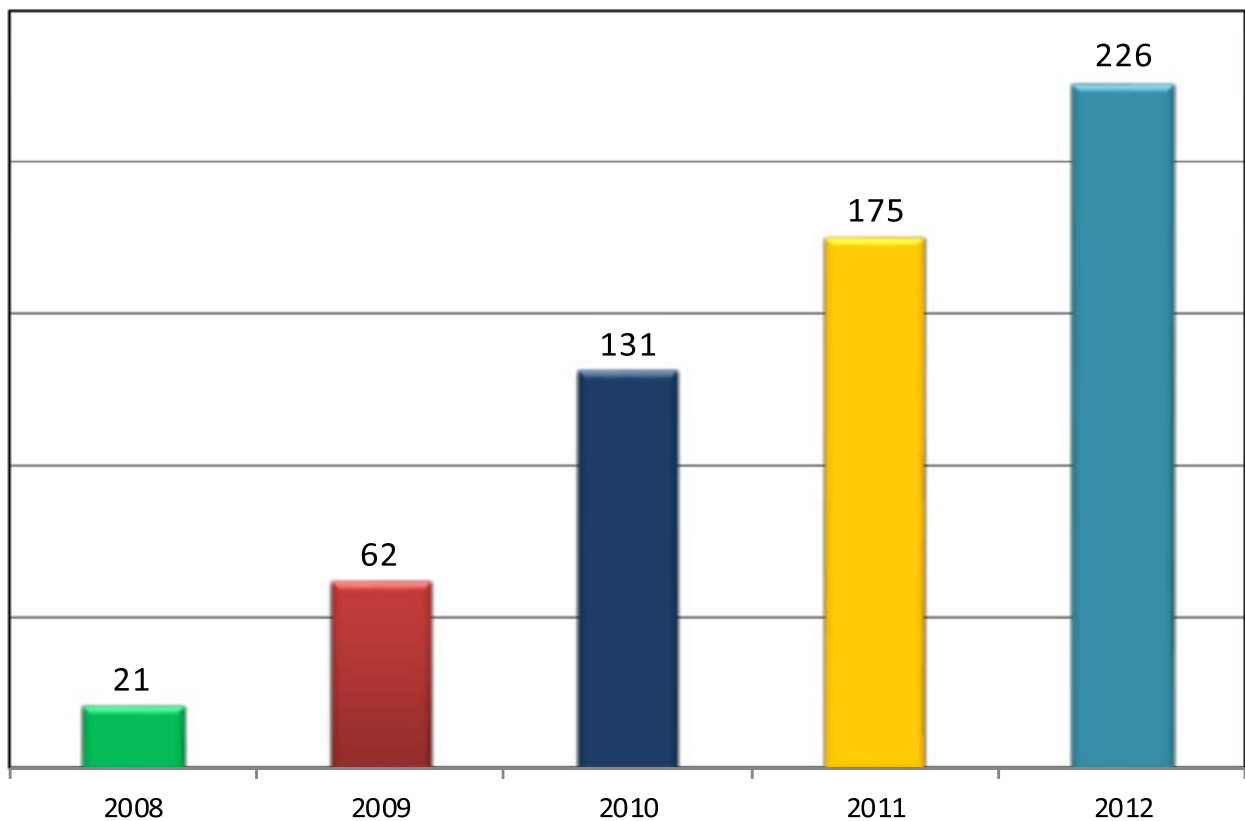

New Pair Registrations Per Month

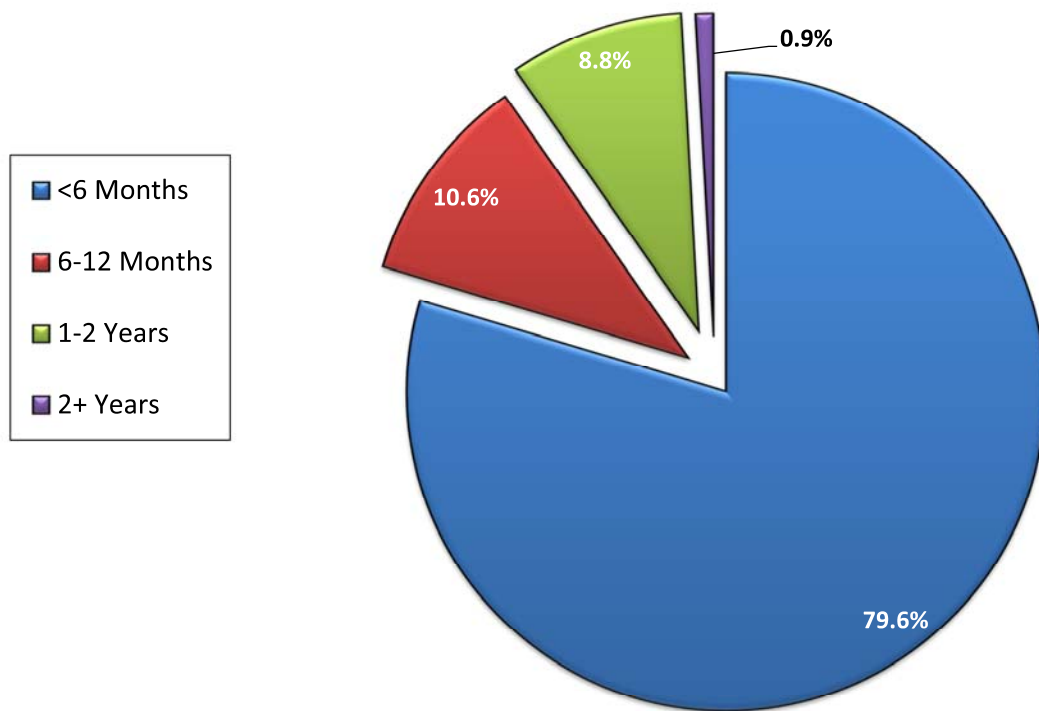


Transplants Facilitated by Year

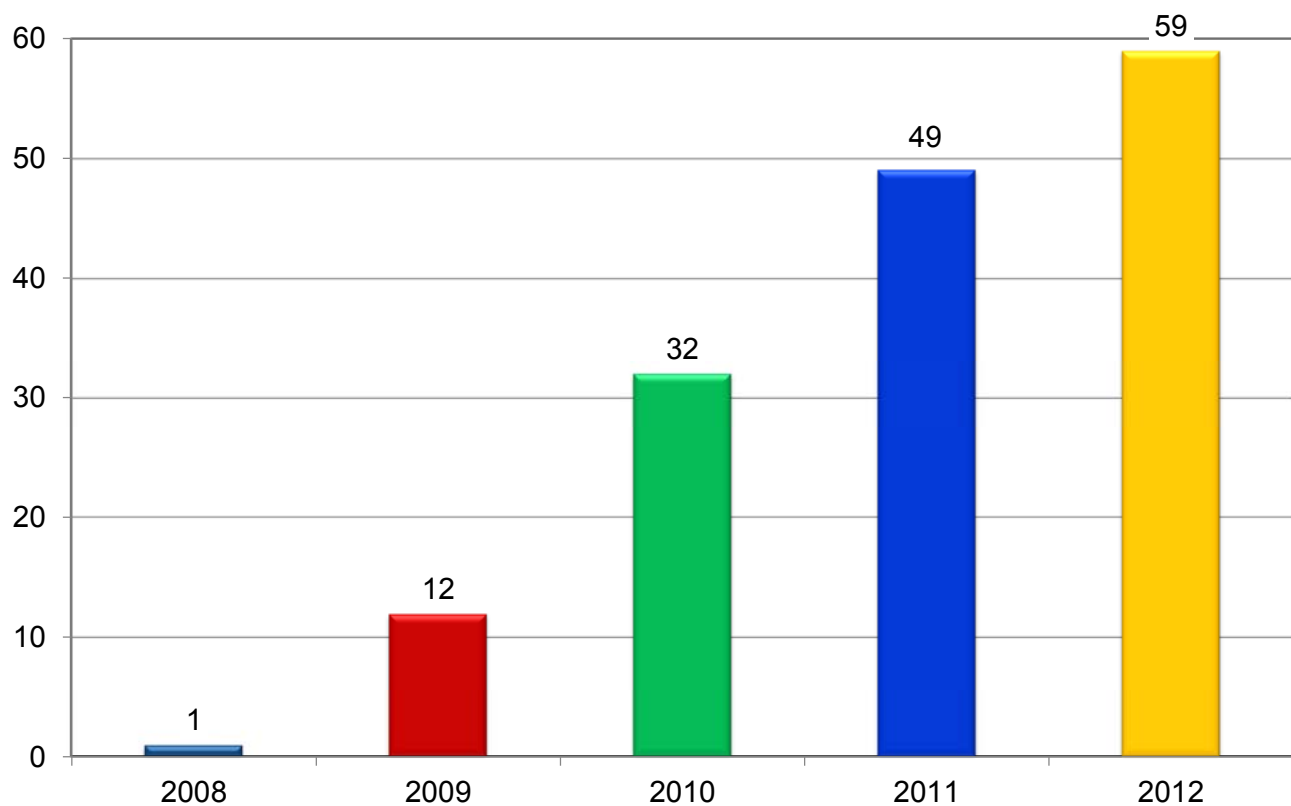


2012 Transplants by Wait Time

90% of transplanted patients waited < 12 months

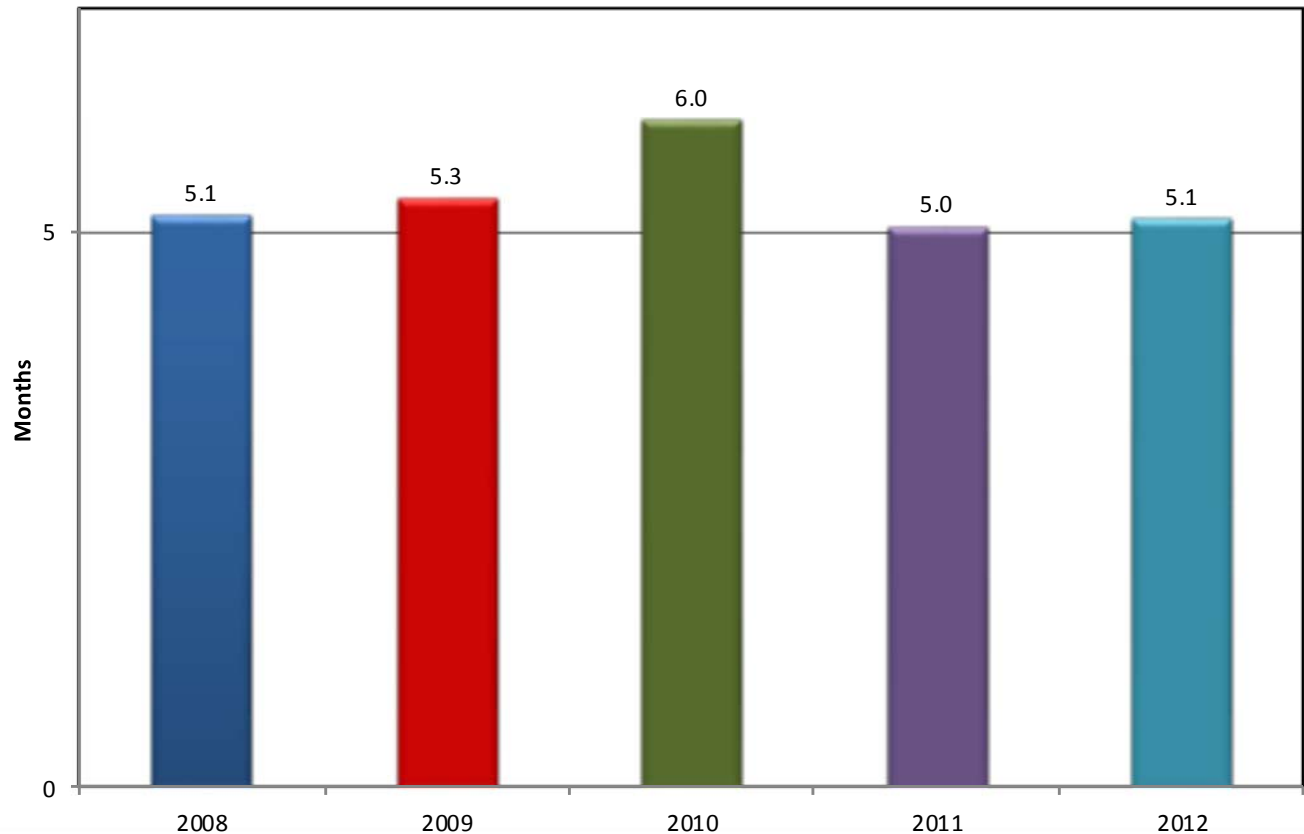


Number of Transplanted Patients with cPRA >80%



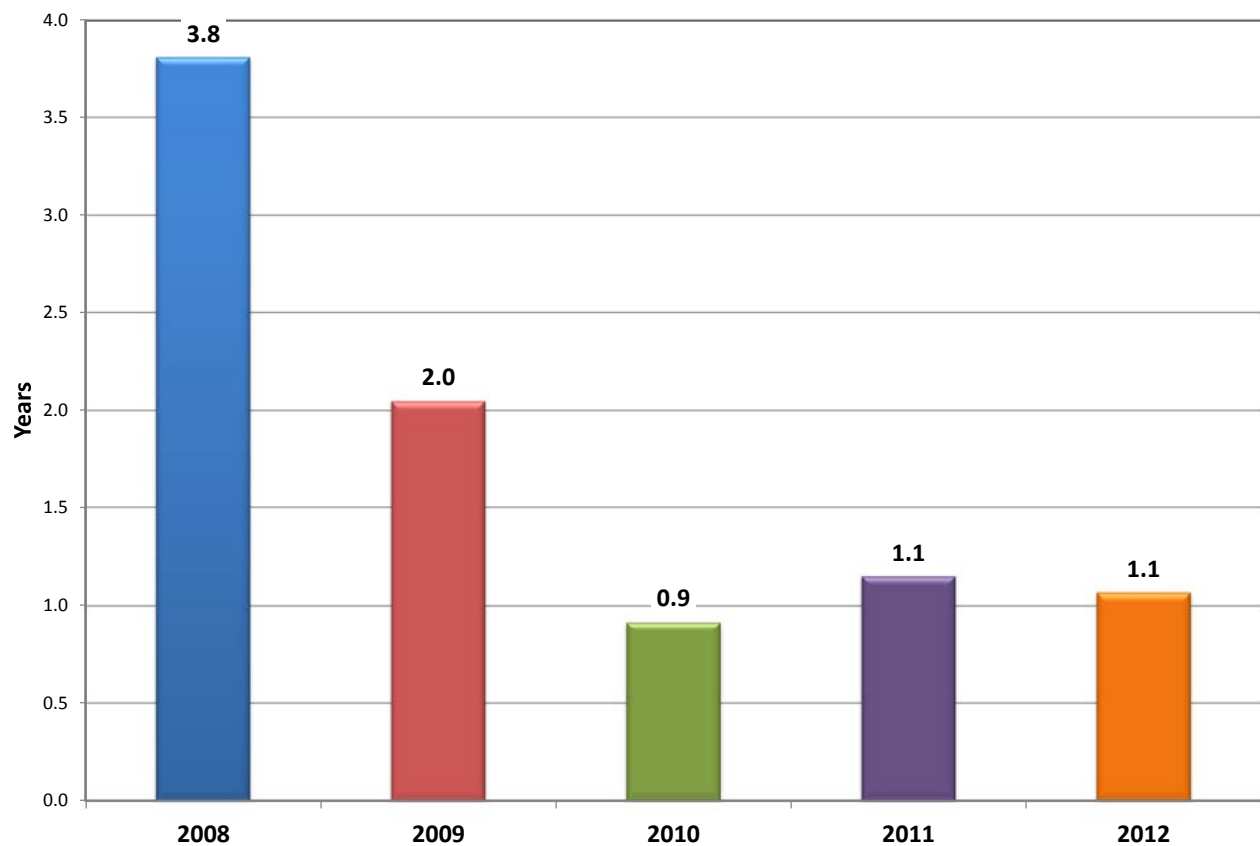
Transplanted Patient Average Wait Time

(wait time = transplant date – enrollment date)



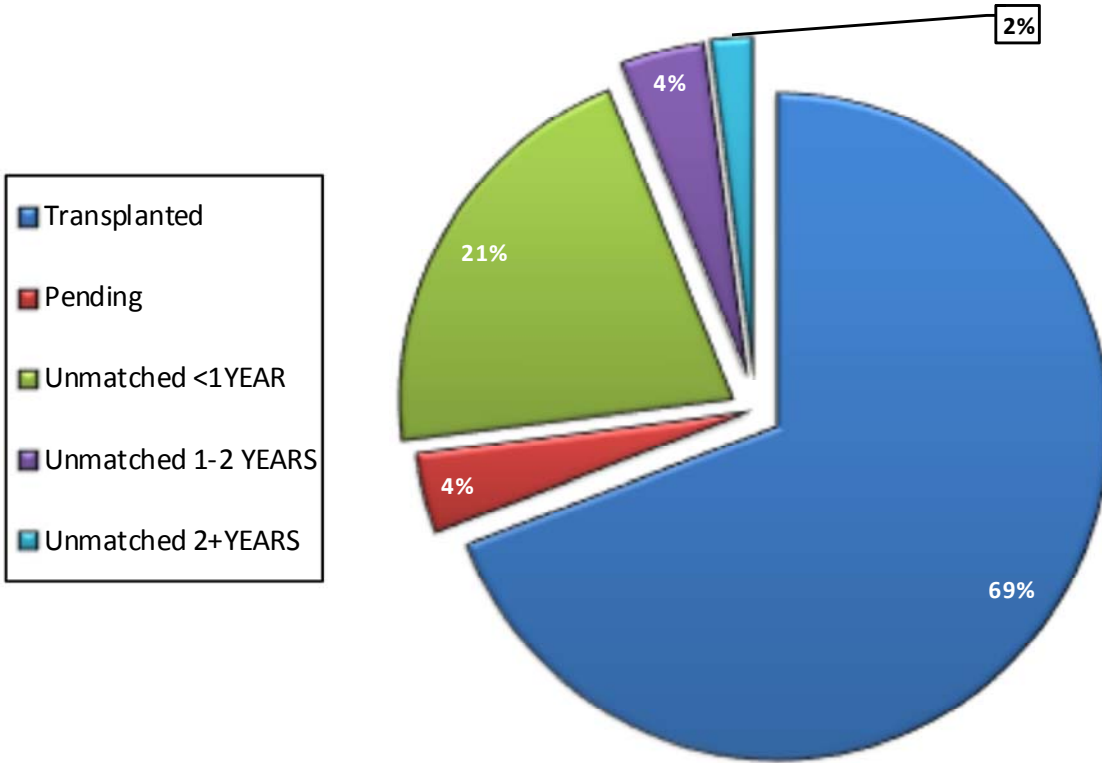
Enrolled Patient Average Wait Time

Ending unmatched patient pool/annual transplant run rate

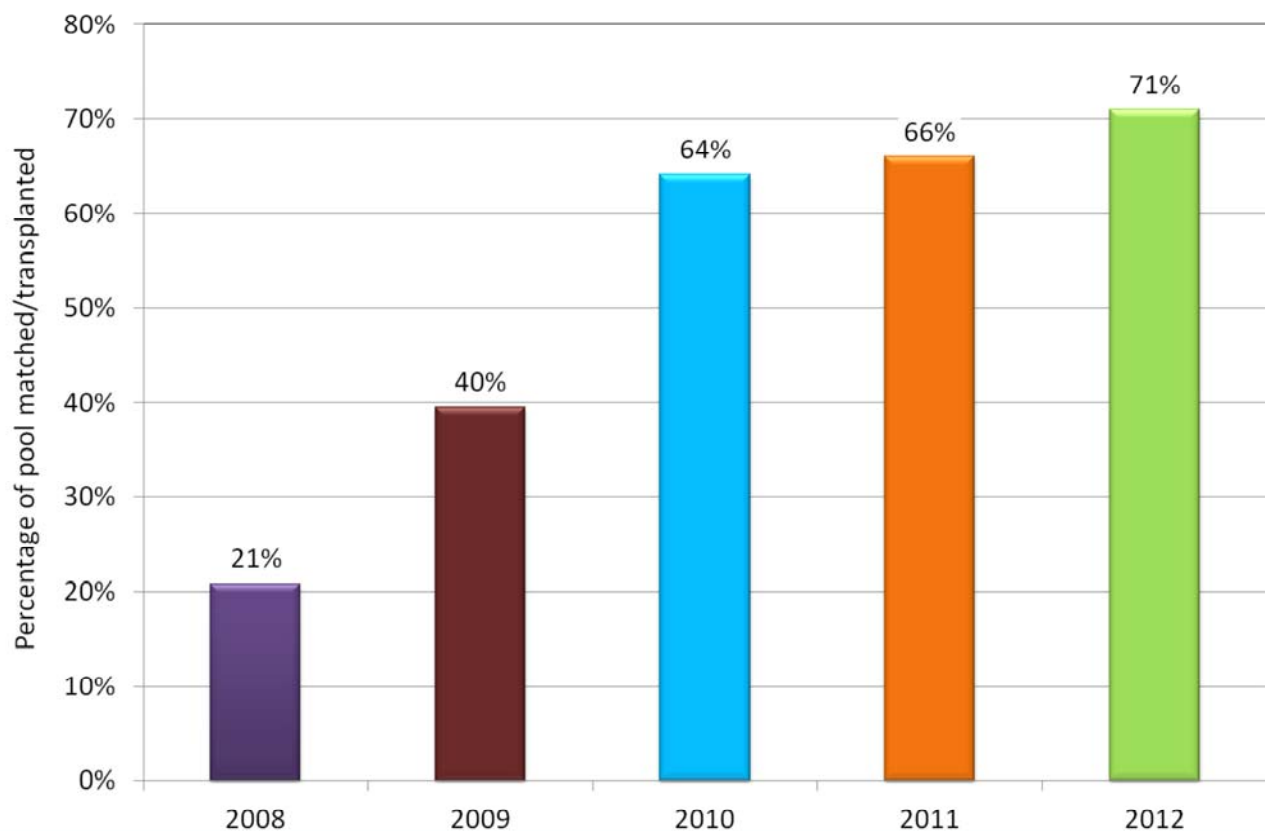


Cumulative Pool Distribution by Status

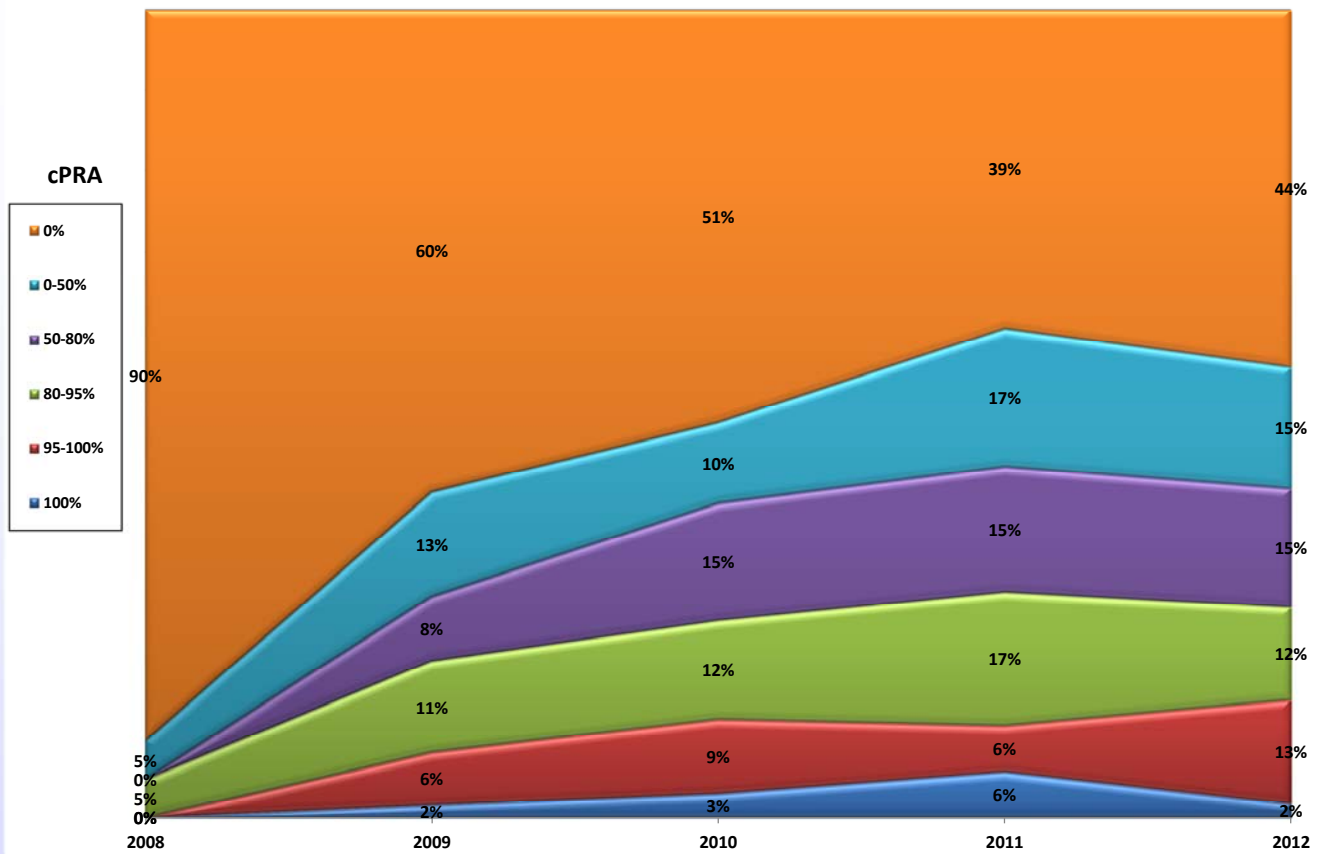

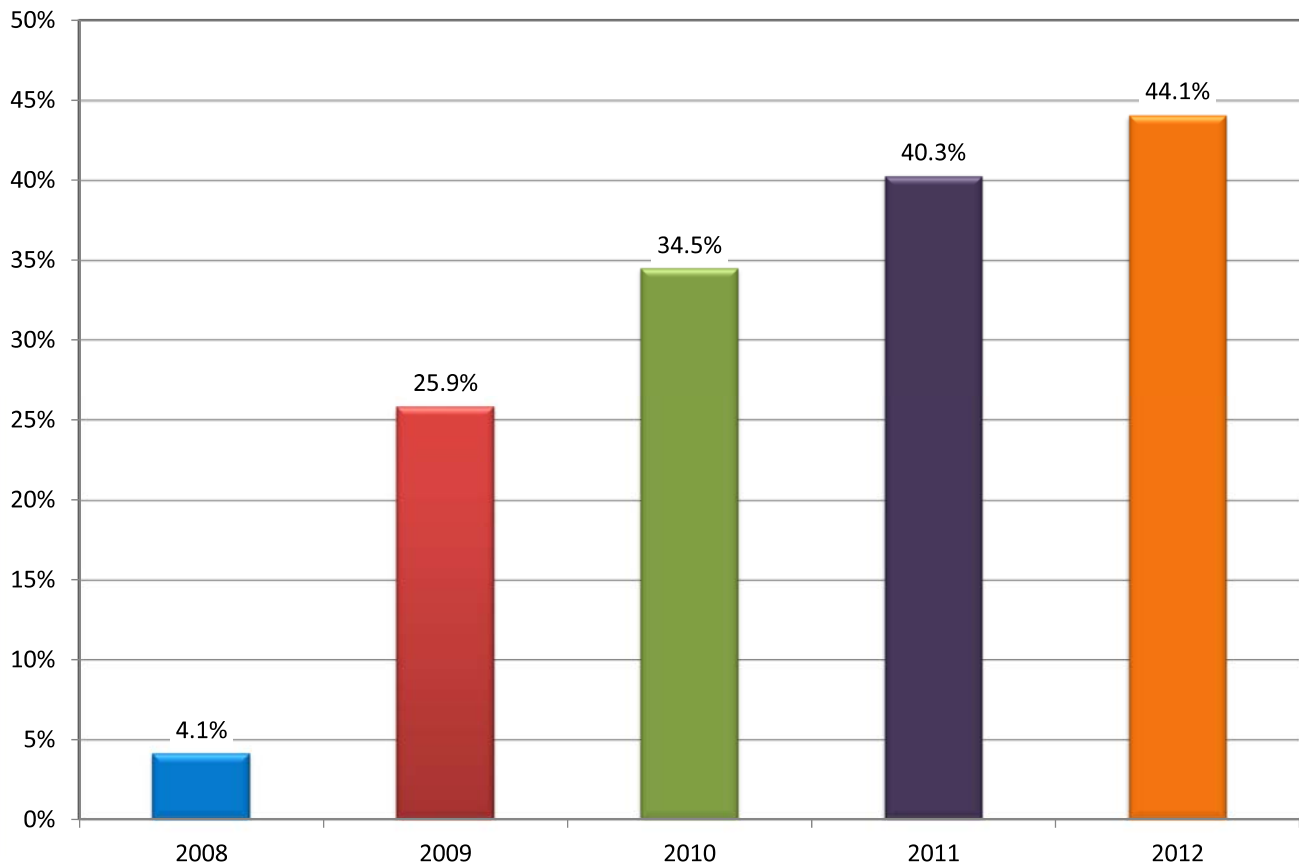
Cumulative Pool Transplanted by Year



Transplanted Patients by Year by cPRA

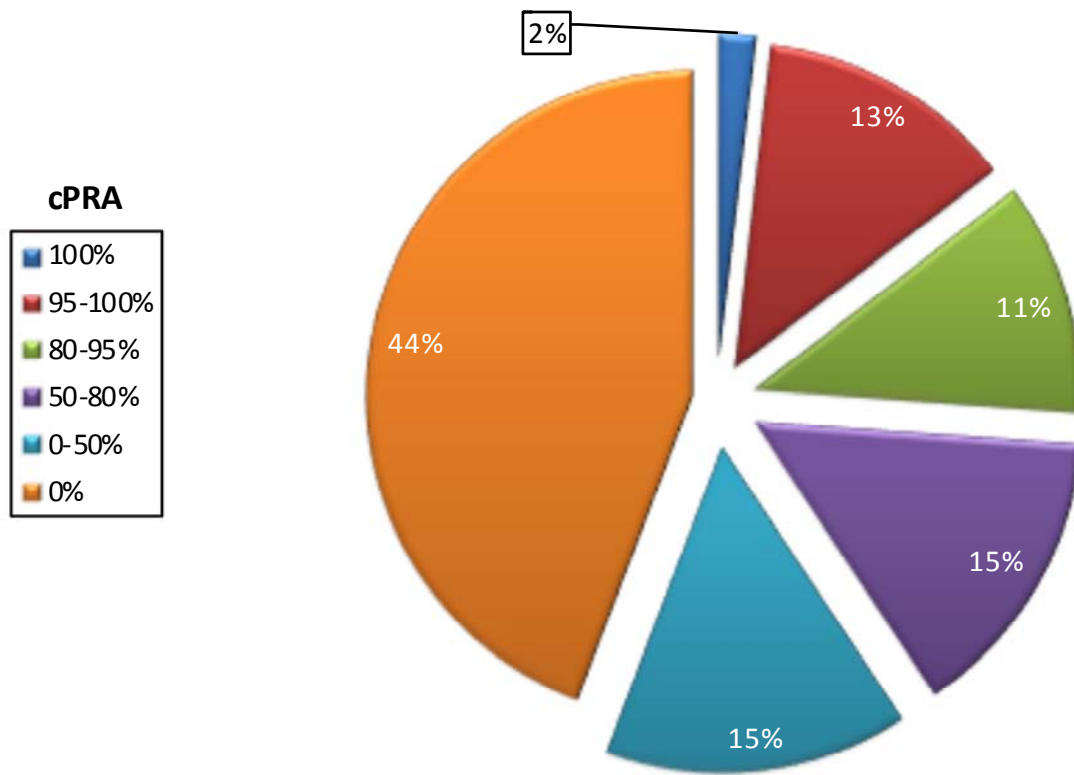


Average cPRA of Transplanted Patients by Year



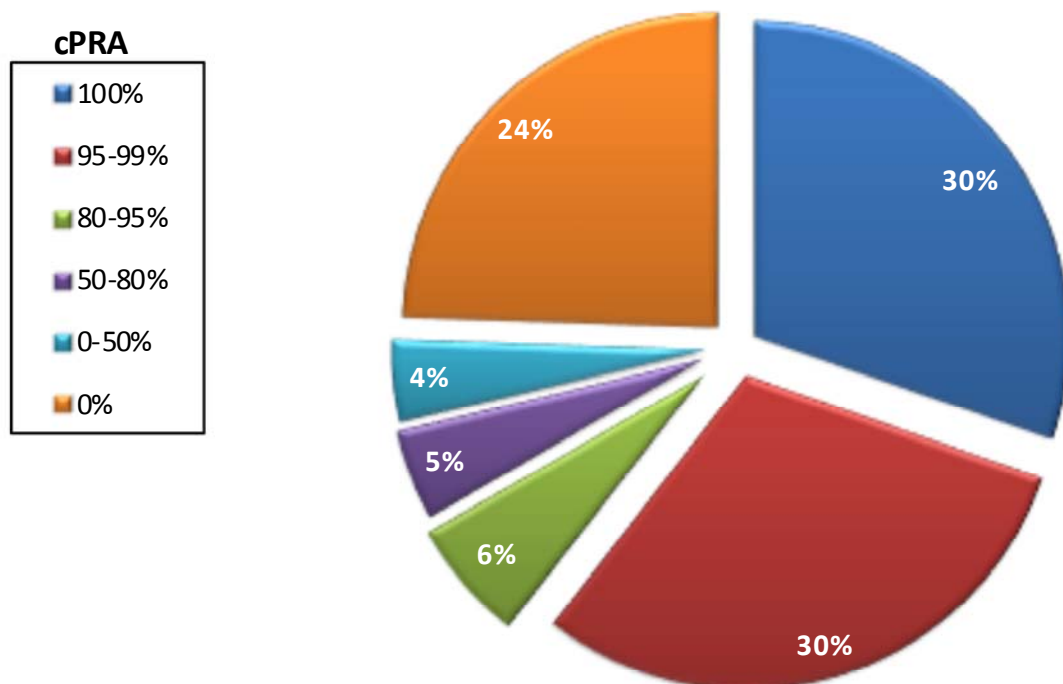

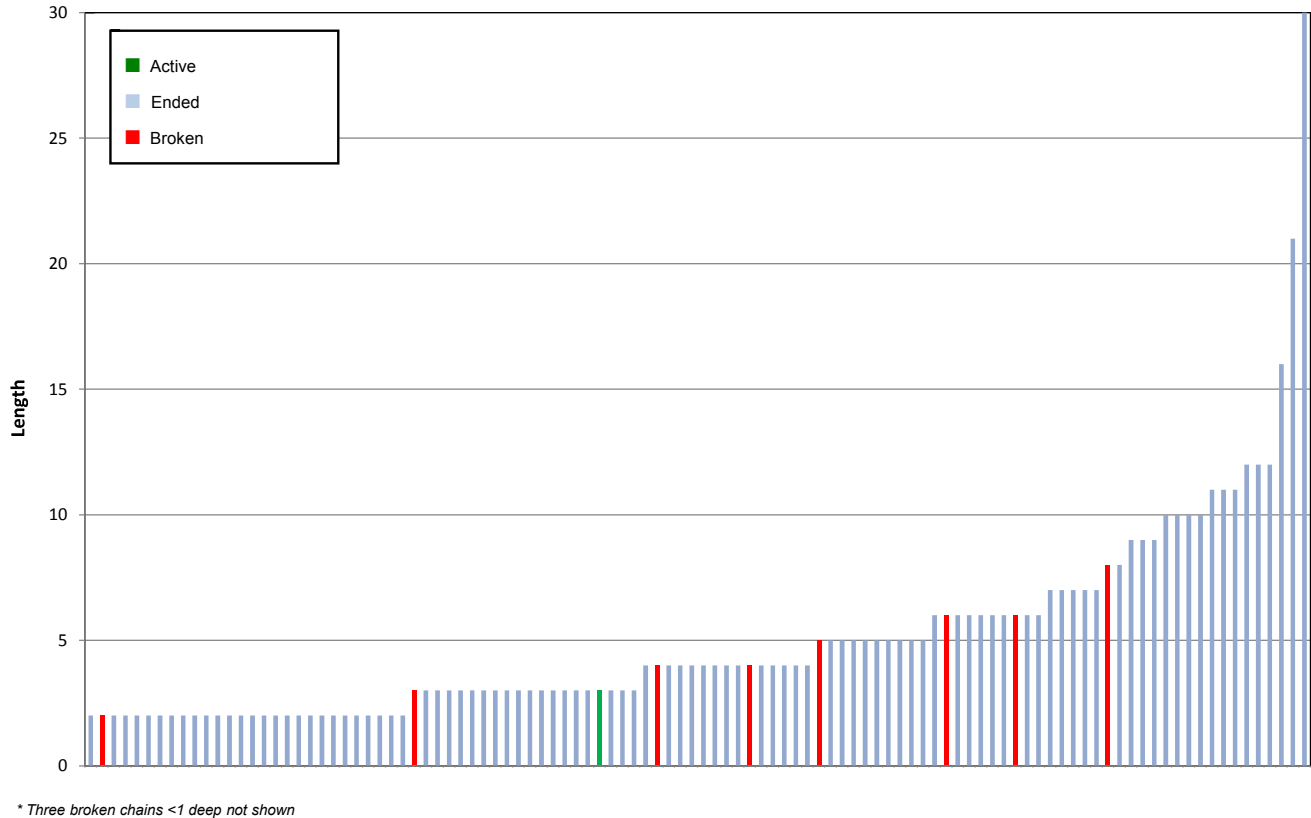
Pool Composition by cPRA

Chain Lengths

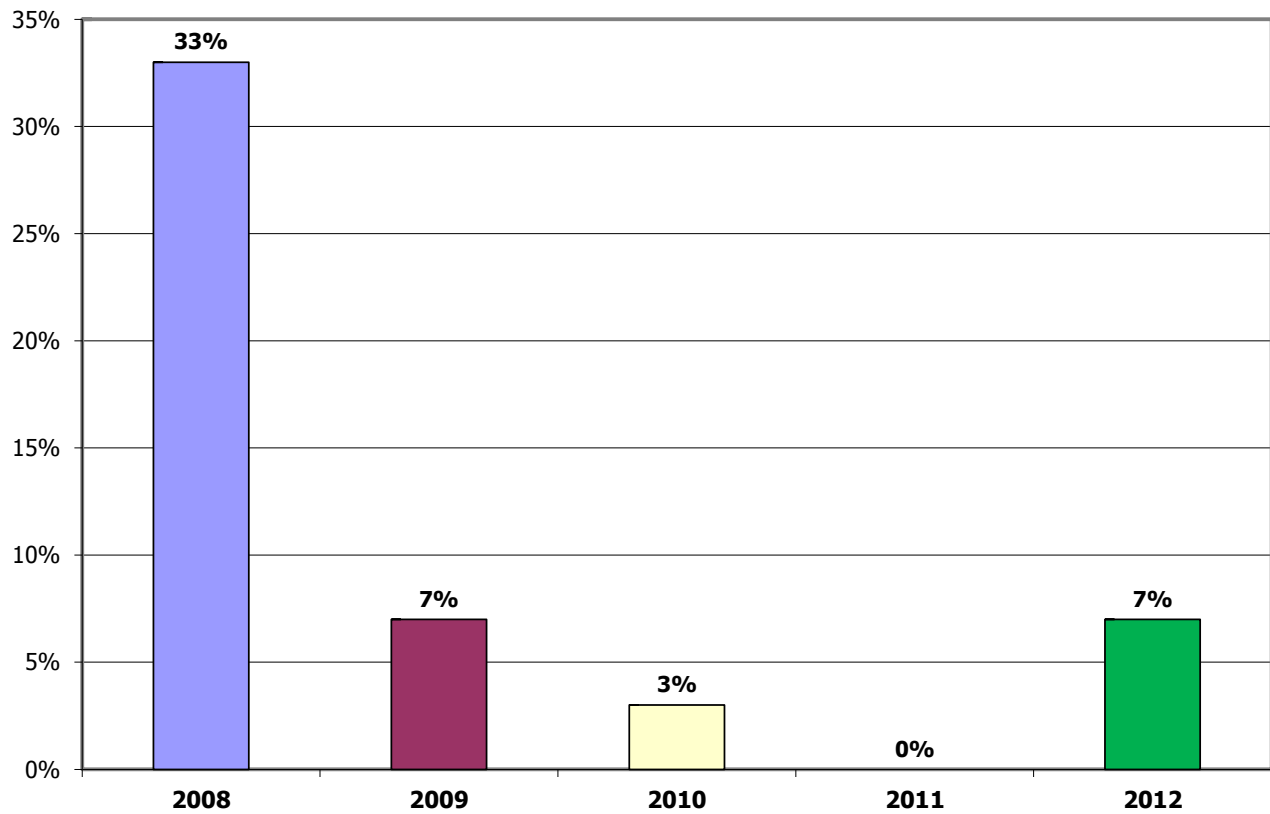
